

Introduction

NCC is a voluntary organization helping India in nation building. NCC plays a vital role in national integration through interaction among different castes, creeds and culture. With a view to giving a boost to the youth in the positive direction, NCC has been included in the course curriculum in all colleges. Today the NCC has an enrolled strength of more than 13 lakhs cadets across the country and it basically comprises of two divisions of all the three Services ie, the Senior Division / Senior Wing for boys / girls from colleges and the Junior Division / Junior Wing for boys / girls from schools. The Motto of NCC is 'Unity and Discipline'.

The NCC units running in universities has two divisions - Senior division (SD) for boys and Senior wing (SW) for girls. A regular professor/teacher working in the university serve as Associate NCC Officer for execution of compulsory classes, parades, social events and other such activities conducted time to time. The duration of the course is of 02 years for passing 'B' certificate examination and 03 years for passing 'C' certificate examination. Every year 01 Combined Annual Training Camp (CATC) camp of 10-12 days duration, Adventure Camp, RDC, Leadership Camp, Thal Sainik Camp (TSC) is organized for basic, advance and specialized training of cadets. During these camps, the cadets participate in different activities like drill, weapon training, field craft and battle craft, obstacle, map reading, essay writing, volley ball competition and tug of war competition. The cadets are also taught various important lessons such as personality development, life skills, national integration etc. for their overall development.









♣ NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian government sector public service program conducted by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports of the Government of India. Popularly known as NSS, the scheme was launched in <u>Gandhiji's</u> Centenary year in 1969. Aimed at developing student's personality through community service, NSS is a voluntary association of young people in Colleges, Universities and at +2 level working for a campus-community (esp. Villages) linkage.

Symbol of N.S.S (National Service Scheme)

The symbol for the NSS has been based on the giant Rath Wheel of the world-famous Konark Sun Temple (The Black Pagoda) situated in Odisha, India. The wheel portrays the cycle of creation, preservation and release. It signifies the movement in life across time and space, the symbol thus stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS for social change. The eight bars in the wheel represent 24 hours of a day. The red colour indicates that the volunteer is full of young blood that is lively, active, energetic and full of high spirit. The navy blue colour indicates the cosmos of which the NSS is tiny part, ready to contribute its share for the welfare of the mankind. It stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS.

Aim

The programme aims to instilling the idea of social welfare in students, and to provide service to society without bias. NSS volunteers work to ensure that everyone who is needy gets help to enhance their standard of living and lead a life of dignity. In doing so, volunteers learn from people in villages how to lead a good life despite a scarcity of resources. it also provides help in natural and man-made disasters by providing food, clothing and first aid to the disaster's victims.

Launch of NSS

In May 1969, a conference of student representatives (of universities and institutions of higher education) convened by the Ministry of Education and the University Grants Commission also unanimously agreed that a national-service scheme could be an instrument for national integration. The Planning Commission sanctioned an outlay of ₹5 crores for the NSS during the Fourth Five-Year Plan, stipulating that the NSS be a pilot project in selected institutions and



universities. On 24 September 1969, the then Union Education Minister V.K.R.V. Rao launched the NSS at 37 universities all states. The scheme has been extended to all states and universities in the country, and also +2 level institutes in many states.

Objectives of NSS

- To enable the students to understand the community in which they work.
- To understand themselves in relation to their community.
- To identify the needs and problems of the community and involve youth in problem solving process.
- To develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility.
- Utilize knowledge of youth in finding practical solution to individual and Community problems.
- To develop competence required for group living and sharing of responsibilities.
- Gain skills in mobilizing community participation.
- Acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude.
- To develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters.
- Practice national integration and social harmony.


NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME ACTIVITIES

The aim of National service scheme is that involving academic community in social service activities and personality development of students through community service. The activities of National Service Scheme are broadly classified in to the two categories like regular activities & special camping activities or programme.

Regular activity:

Under Regular activities, students are expected to work as NSS volunteers for consecutive two years; he will devote 120 hours per year. The regular activities include constructive work in adopted villages and slums, blood donation, adult and non-formal education, health, nutrition, family welfare, AIDS awareness campaigns, tree plantation and improvement of campuses etc. The 120 hours spend by the volunteers in the NSS regular activities are classified in the following way.

- Orientation 20 hrs.
- Shramdan (Tree Plantation, Constructive work etc) 40 hrs.



- Environment Awareness 20 hrs.
- Health Programme 20 hrs
- Drive against Social Evils 20 hrs.

In this period, NSS volunteers have to work in their adopted villages or slums so that they can understand the problems or issues of the community which helps for development of the society. Special Camping Programme

Under Special Camping programme, an eight days camp is conducted every year in the adopted villages/adopted area on specific themes. Every college participating in NSS is expected to hold a Youth for Rural Reconstruction Camp. The main objectives of NSS are to identify the requirements of the community and to encourage the youth to satisfy these requirements and to prepare the volunteers for their future role as sensitized, but self confident community persons. NSS Volunteers are always ready to accept the challenges for solving the community problems. The NSS channelized its volunteer force to make all possible support to help the affected people. Special Camping forms an integral part of the National Service scheme. Special camping programmes are benefitted to the youth because it provides unique opportunities to the students for group-living, collective experience sharing and constant interaction with the community.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME VOLUNTEERS

Since National Service Scheme is aimed at developing the personality of NSS volunteers through community service, hence, all NSS activities provide an opportunity to NSS volunteers to involve themselves in community service. A student enrolled as NSS volunteers will have to put in 120 hours for community work in a year for a period of 2 years.

Duties of NSS Volunteer

- To establish rapport with the people in the project area;
- Identify needs, problems and resources of the community;
- c. Plan programmes and carry out the plans;
- d. Relate learning and experience towards finding solutions to the problems identified;
- e. Record the activities in work diary systematically and assess the progress periodically and effect changes, as and when needed.

Code of Conduct for NSS Volunteers

 All volunteers shall work under the guidance of a group leader nominated by the Programme Officer.

- 2. They shall make themselves worthy of the confidence and cooperation of the group/community leadership.
- They shall scrupulously avoid entering into any controversial issues.
- 4. They shall keep day-to-day record of their activities/ experience in the enclosing pages of the diary and submit to the Programme Officer for guidance.
- 5. It is obligatory on the part of every volunteer to wear the NSS BADGE while on work.

Role of NSS Volunteer

A NSS Volunteer is a student in the college who was enrolled his name in the National service Scheme. The roles of the NSS volunteers are very important according to the National Service Scheme because they are main beneficiary of the programme. The NSS volunteers must actively participate in the NSS activities. The NSS volunteers perform the role of mediator between the education system and the community which is helpful for the nation building. They are developing their qualities of leadership, skills to become an organizer, and an administrator and to attain the multi-faceted development of his/ her personality as a whole.

National Service Scheme (NSS) has been introduced at Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel University of Agriculture and Technology since 2015 as a part of the academic programs and since then NSS has been functioning as a regular feature in the realm of our university education. The overall objective of the scheme is educational and service to the community; hence, several activities through which the objective is sought to be achieved were performed. It is a student-cantered program in which projects are implemented by the NSS volunteers in the community in close collaboration with the community and thereby it provides vast scope for the student's interaction with the people. In SVPUAT, Meerut the NSS programme is coordinated by Dr. R.S. Sengar. There are five units running in university, Two each in College of Agriculture and College of Biotechnology, and 01 in College of Veterinary & Animal Sciences. The program officers are Dr. Pankaj Chauhan COB Unit 1, Dr. Neelesh Kapoor COB Unit 2, Dr. V. K. Singh COA Unit 3, Dr. Ashok Yadav COA Unit 4 and Dr. Kuldeep Tyagi COVAS Unit 5.

The activities performed by COB Unit 1 and 2 in the academic session 2018-19 are as follows:

- On 11th September 2018 N.S.S. volunteers of COB organized Kerala Relief Fund Rally and collected total amount of Rs.10000/- for peoples of Kerala flood victims.
- Program on World Brotherhood Day was celebrated on 11th September, in the NSS auditorium, World Brother's Day was organized, Dr. Rekha Dixit, Dr. Neelesh Kapoor, Dr. Pankaj Chauhan explained in detail about World Fraternity Day.
- On 8th October 2018 Blood Donation camp was organized in university. Total 25 NSS volunteers were worked as volunteer.
- 4. In Kisan mela at SVPUAT held on 12-14 October 2018, NSS volunteers of college of biotechnology explains farmers/visitors regarding latest technology of farming, about cleanliness, Swatch Bharat Abhiyan, Government schemes etc.
- On 15th December 2018 tree plantation campaign was organized in college campus.
 Several medicinal plants and trees were planted in college campus.
- 12th January 2019 National Youth Day, Birthdays of Swami Vivekanda was celebrated.
- To know the importance of Swachata a Cleanliness Day was conducted on 14th January
 2019 in which 55 NSS volunteers of COB cleans college and hostels premises.
- College's NSS subunit has intently worked on making our campus clean and litter free.
 In this regard multiple cleaning, litter picking, weeding and planting vegetation sessions were also



organized in our university campus time to time.

- 9. On 8th February 2018 a one day program in lieu of Shiksha Abhiyan conducted by Dr. Neelesh Kapoor with NSS volunteers in which tips were given to students of nearby villages appearing in board exams. They were guided by faculty members of COB and COVAS for how to prepare for the board exams, how to make stress free environment along with career guidance tips.
- 10. N.S.S students of College of Biotechnology organized a candle march to condemn dreaded terrorist attack in Pulwama on 14th Feb, 2019 which got a lot of support from the other colleges of the university. Teachers and students actively participated and supported this march.
- 11. For the promotion of voting in Lok Sabha elections of 2019 a voting campaign was organized by the students of N.S.S of College of Biotechnology on 8th April, 2019.



16. Debate on Farming Bills

Debate on farmers bill was organized on 10.03.2023 about, What Is the Farm Bill? The farm bill is an omnibus, multiyear law that governs an array of agricultural and food programs. It provides an opportunity for policymakers to comprehensively and periodically address agricultural and food issues. In addition to developing and enacting farm legislation, Congress is involved in overseeing its implementation. The farm bill typically is renewed about every five years. Since the 1930s, Congress has enacted 18 farm bills. Farm bills traditionally have focused on farm commodity program support for a handful of staple commodities—corn, soybeans, wheat, cotton, rice, peanuts, dairy, and sugar. Farm bills have become increasingly expansive in nature since 1973, when a nutrition title was first included. Other prominent additions since then include horticulture and bioenergy titles and expansion of conservation, research, and rural development titles. Without reauthorization, some farm bill programs would expire, such as the nutrition assistance and farm commodity support programs. Other programs have permanent authority and do not need reauthorization (e.g., crop

insurance) and are included in a farm bill to make policy changes or achieve budgetary goals.

The farm bill extends authorizations of discretionary programs. The farm bill also suspends long- abandoned permanent laws for certain farm.
